



Alternate Camping Locations

There is no trash collection service in the National Forest. Please take your trash with you. Cleaning up any litter you find left by others would help preserve our natural resources.

Developed Campgrounds: (fee required) Kelly-Dahl Brainard Lake Peaceful Valley/ Camp Dick

Designated Campsites only: "West Magnolia" Caribou Townsite/ FDR 505 Gordon Gulch

possible dispersed camping areas: Ruby Gulch - mile 40 on Hwy 72 Rollins Pass Rd.

Please bury human waste 6-8" deep, at least 100 ft. from any water source, including dry stream beds.

Campfire restrictions may be in effect at any time

Camping in the Arapaho-Roosevelt National Forest

To protect wildlife habitat, camping in this area is limited to "designated campsites only". Please observe this restriction.

Camping in the ARNF is limited to no more than 28 days in any 60 day period. You may not occupy any campsite for more than 14 days, and no camp can be within 3 miles of a previous campsite.

Campsites may be occupied by no more than 5 persons, unless all occupants are immediate family.

The National Forest is a resource for all citizens to enjoy and use in a responsible manner, but...

You are not allowed to live here.
